Last year Mr. Rosset's class fundraised to purchase an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) for the school. This was purchased for the safety of our students, staff and those visiting our school. Staff have been trained on how to use it and it will be placed in the hallway by the gym.



NOON HOUR EXPECTATIONS

Students staying for lunch must eat in their homeroom classroom. They are not allowed to eat elsewhere. This includes outside. If students are found eating outside (11:48-12:10), this will be considered a lunch hour violation, and will be reported to the office.

Unless the EA/Teacher makes alternate arrangements, students must eat at their own desk. Rooms are to be cleaned up before dismissing at 12:10. Garbage must be off all desks and floors. Desks will be cleaned by our custodian in rooms where students have allergies.

Due to allergies, it is preferable that students not share food.

Students are not allowed to go to the Coop at any time, including at 11:50 to buy a lunch, unless the office receives a note. (For bus students, this also applies to before or after school.) Any students reported or caught going to the Co-op will receive a warning, parents will be contacted and any future violations may result in suspension (may be an ISS or an OSS, depending on the situation) or loss of privilege to stay at school for lunch.

Students staying for lunch may not leave the grounds at any time. (Students who usually stay for lunch, may only leave the grounds, if there is parental consent with a note and it is provided to the office/EA on duty. Staff may phone the parent/guardian if there is any question of its validity.

At 12:10, all students must go outside. No lingering. The playground is divided into areas based on what typically goes on outside. This may or may not change from year to year. Gr. 7 and 8's are not allowed on the play structures.

If Indoor recess, students have several activities/areas to choose from. Typically the large computer lab, power mech., and ONE designated classroom for Gr. 7's and 8's; the small computer lab, the library and homerooms for Gr. 5's and 6's. This is subject to change. Students, however, will choose one of the areas and remain there until 12:48. They are not allowed to change areas. There is a sign-in sheet/binder in the library and the computer labs. Rules are listed below but may change as needed.

Rules for Computer Labs: No hats, no MSN, no Facebook, no Twitter, no e-mail, no violent games. One student per computer.

Rules for Power Mech.: No hats, no cell phones, no movies on Ipods or MP4's, no roughhousing, no gathering around Ping Pong tables... Spectators to be seated on bleachers. Bathroom breaks will be one at a time.

Rules for Library: No hats, no cell phones, no wandering around, no signing out books, bathroom breaks one at a time. Ipods allowed...quietly.

Intramurals are held various days at lunch, as are Student Council and SSG meetings, drama, and choir. These will be announced.

Students are not allowed to remain in their classrooms to work unless supervised by a teacher. Alternate arrangements may be made IF an EA and the teacher on duty in the Office is notified.

IMPORTANT TRAFFIC FLOW NOTICE

We appreciate everyone's cooperation with the Student Drop-Off at the south end of the school. Please do not park there. When dropping off or picking up pull ahead as much as possible.

Please do not drop students off at the side of the road, or across the street, as we do not have patrols at the crosswalk.

Students are welcome to ride their bikes to school but are reminded to stay off the bus loop. Students should also **NOT** ride their bikes through the parking lot as there is too much traffic. Students who are meeting their parents at ECVS need to walk around the back of the ECVS building and not walk through the Staff parking lot.

E.A.M.S bus students should stay on the bus rather than getting off at École Crescentview School in the morning. They should also board the bus at École Arthur Meighen School at 3:30 p.m. rather than walking to E.C.V.S.

DRESS CODE CLARIFICATION

In general, students are requested to dress in such a manner that would indicate pride and self-respect and that they have pride and respect for their school. This applies to Field Trips and Dances as well. This includes the following:

- No hats/headcoverings inside the school
- No Sunglasses inside the school
- No chains (large /dog-collar-type or attached to wallets)
- No t-shirts with objectionable material, including promotional references to: drugs, alcohol, swear words, violence, gangs, degrading oneself or others, any other unwholesome ideas
- Midriff and back are to be covered
- tops must not be revealing and/or low-cut
- No muscle shirts (different from sleeveless shirts/tank tops, which are allowed)
- No halter-tops/tube tops without sweater or covering over top
- Spaghetti straps must be of a two-finger-width
- Underwear must not be showing (tops or bottoms)
- Shorts and skirts must be no higher than the index finger if hands are loosely at sides
- Footwear must be worn at all times
- Gang colours and/or paraphernalia are prohibited/No hoods up on hoodies
- *Hats and sunglasses may be worn for special dress-up days.
- *In the event that students have not respected the dress code whether at school/dances/field trips and do not have alternate clothing available or they are unable to return home to change, they will be provided with appropriate clothing where possible. Often, however, they are simply asked to change into their gym short or provided with a hoodie or a sweater to cover up with.
