Portage la Prairie Hutterian Schools Accountability Report to Parents 2009-2010 School Year

Accountability Report:

The Hutterian Schools Department works closely with its staff, students and parent advisory council. At our meetings, goals and concerns are identified and plans are developed. The following is a summary of our schools mission and mandate statements as well as the education goals, plans and successes that have been achieved during the school year. We believe that a strong partnership between the staff, students, and parent advisory committee members is essential to improve the education for students at our colony schools. We believe that school planning, school visitations, and the partnership with the Hutterian Communities and our schools is crucial to student success. The following report has been prepared to continue to keep the parents of our communities students and their informed.

Mission: Partners Pursuing Quality Education

Mandate: Hutterian schools are responsible for ensuring that all students have the opportunity to acquire the basic knowledge, skills and attitudes needed to be self-reliant, responsible, caring and contributing members of a Hutterian community without having to leave their home community or compromise Colony beliefs.

Hutterian Schools Profile:

The Hutterian Schools are a collection of 10 schools which are located at 10 Hutterite Colonies around Portage la Prairie, with a student population of 257 students. We had 23 professional teaching staff, 1 supervisor, 1 resource staff and a support staff of 7 teacher assistants and 1 secretary. A Kindergarten to Grade 8 English Program is delivered at each of the 10 schools by the site teachers. A Senior 1 to Senior 4 English Program is delivered by a team of 5 high school teachers using a ITV system and rotating school visits. This program is also delivered to three schools from the Pine Creek School Division and two schools from the Lakeshore School Division.

Goal 1: Students achieve high standards in an education focused on what students need to learn.

Goal 2: To enable the Hutterian Schools' Advisory Council to be an effective voice and support for education.

Goal 3: To provide the necessary professional development to support the staff (professional & support) as they strive to reach the other goals.

Goal 4: To secure the technology that will enhance student learning, and increase efficiency and flexibility of delivery.

Hutterian Schools Accomplishments

- Changes in education curricula has meant that teachers have spent many hours reading, attending PD, and discussing with colleagues and in grade group and subject group meetings.
- A total of thirteen Student received their high school diplomas in June 2010.
- Sharing of Hutterian financial information with German teachers took place at each Parent Advisory Council Meeting as well as with the teaching staff at staff meetings.
- The High School expanded to include Forest Home School Riverdale Colony.
- The Early Literacy program continued to be an asset.
- Schools held a fundraiser to go toward the PCU centre.
- Early Years Teachers received intensive training in a new math program "First Steps in Math".
- Welcome to Kindergarten bags were distributed to all preschool children who would enter Kindergarten in September.

- The Hutterian High School Program added a new school (Forest Home) to the system raising the total number of schools participating to 14. The schools participating in the Portage Hutterian High School system included Brantwood, Good Hope, Ingleside, Norquay, Northern Breeze, Sommerfeld, Sunnyside, Westroc, and Wood-lands from the Portage School Division; Beaver Creek, Muller, and Forest Home from the Pine Creek School Division; and Marble Ridge and Broad Valley from the Lakeshore School Division.
- The 2009/2010 academic year marked the second year in which High School courses were offered over the ITV system, and the first year in which none of our High schools were signing in to courses over teleconferencing system (Marble Ridge and Broad Valley Schools were previously participating through teleconference).
- Thirteen students graduated from the High School program.
- The Governor General's medal was awarded to Andrea Gross from Muller School.
